Arizona Biomedical Collaborative No. 1 has received a gold certification from the **U.S. Green Building Council's** Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design program.

The 85,069-square-foot building at Fifth and Van Buren streets in Phoenix is a cooperative between Arizona State University and the University of Arizona.

It was designed by SmithGroup in Phoenix and built by DPR construction.

The building, which features a 30 percent savings in energy costs and had 86 percent of its construction waste diverted from landfills, will be featured as part of the USGBC's Greenbuild International Conference and Expo and a series of project tours.
